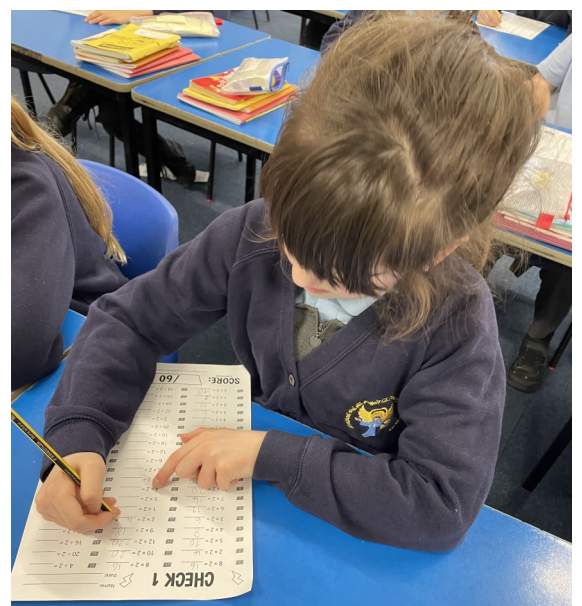
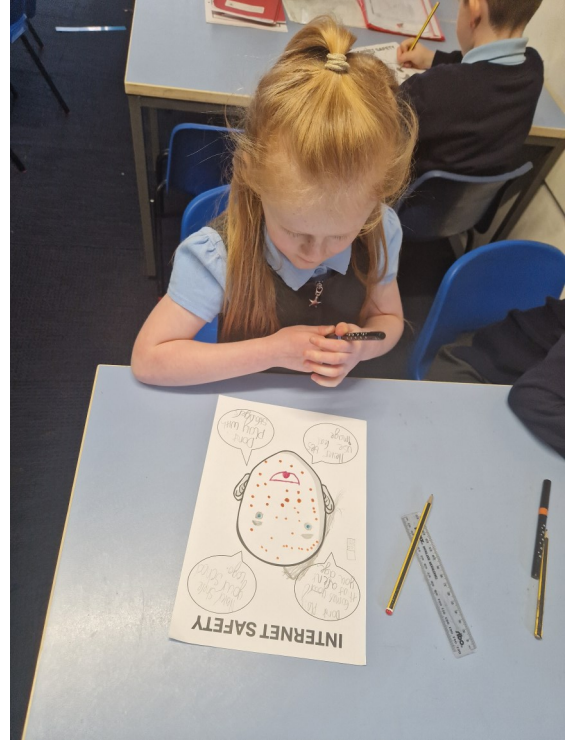
Happy Safer Internet Day everyone!
