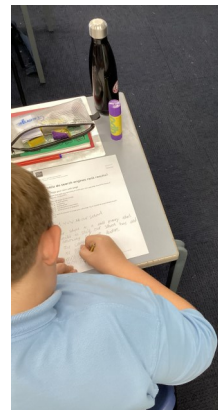
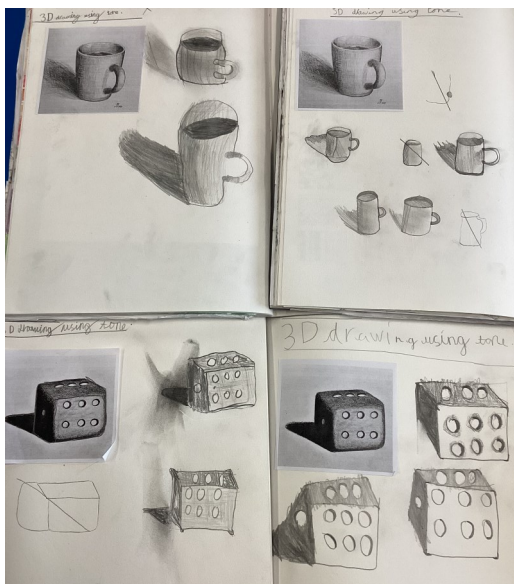
Year 2 have been conducting an experiment to answer the question 'Do our feet get bigger as we get older'. We've measured a child's foot in each class from Reception all the way to Year 6, as well as Mrs Walsh and Miss Stewart's. We made lots of predictions before the start of the investigation and found that, although our feet do get bigger as we grow, we all grow at different rates. We used Nelly and Alice in our evidence as they were born on the same day but are different heights and shoe sizes.

In science, Year 3 have been learning about animals and humans. Over the last few weeks we have learnt about the different types of skeletons and the different bones in our body.



Year 5 have been learning about what an Anglo-Saxon village would have looked like. We identified what would be in a village, and started to design our own.

Year 4 have been exploring how to make our drawings look 3D. We have used different grades of pencils to create different tones and also looked at the shading techniques. We discussed the importance of drawing more than one example to improve our techniques each time.



In Computing, Year 6 have been looking what components make up a good website. We discovered that sites with high word repetition rank higher in the search results. Year 6 are looking forward to designing and creating their own websites soon!
