Date of coronation 6th October 2023

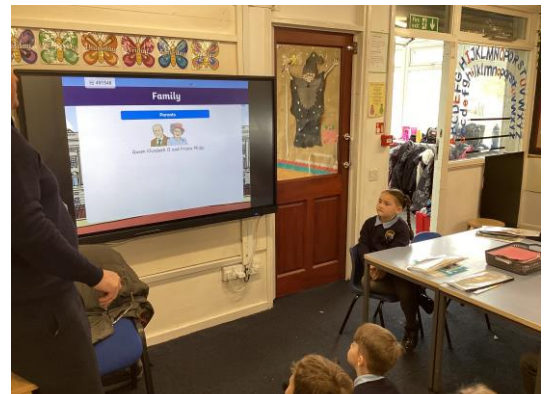
Family: Queen Elisabeth and Prince Philip and Camilla and Prince Harry and Prince George and Prince Louis and Princess Charlotte

What does a monarch do? Having weekly meetings with the prime minister and opening new sessions of parliament and hosting visitors such as heads of state.

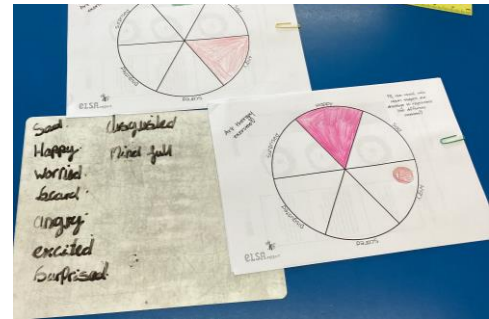
Did you know: Prince Charles wrote a number of books including the old man of Lochness and he sold organic food products as well.



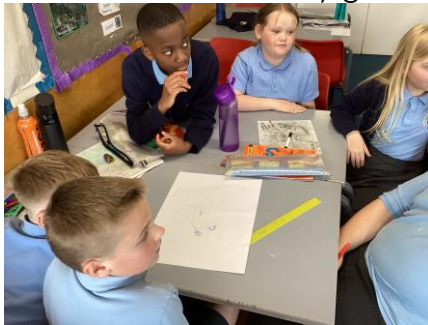
Continuing with our DT project, this week Year 3 have been assembling pre-drawn nets. This was quite tricky for some children but a good opportunity to show resilience.
