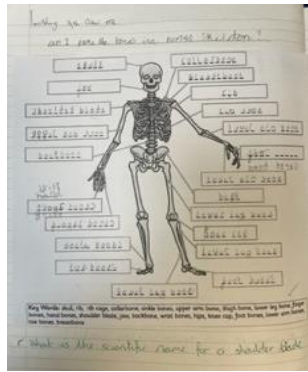
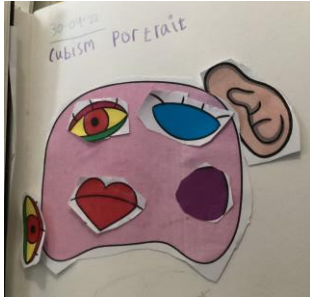
In Reception we have been learning about hedgehogs. The children used clay to make their own hedgehogs and collected sticks to use for the spines!



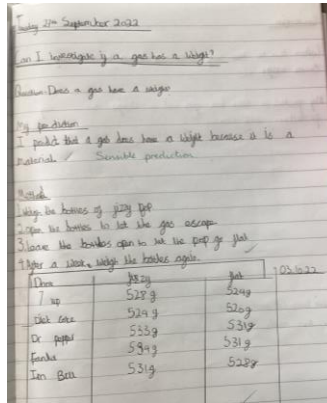

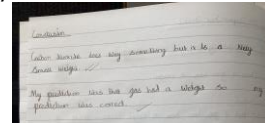
Year 2 have been looking at the work of Picasso in art. In order to create our cubism inspired portrait we created collages using different facial features to create the affect.
