
Responsibility



In Pre-School and Reception, we take pride in our learning by listening carefully and doing our best.


We start working on writing letters and numbers. We work hard to write our name.









In KS1, we develop a love of learning through putting time and effort into all that we do. We love to practice our key skills and improve every day.
